Members of Putnam County Emergency Services;

The Brewster Central School District and the Brewster Education Foundation have extended an invitation to all County Emergency Responders to attend the “9-11 Never Forget Mobile Exhibit” which is dedicated to commemorate those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001. The exhibit will be visiting Brewster High School during the week of September 15 through Sept. 19.

The traveling exhibit is a high tech, 53-foot tractor trailer which unfolds into a 1,100-square-foot display and serves as a poignant reminder of that infamous day. Thanks to BHS Principal Joseph Castagnola who arranged for the exhibit to visit Brewster, we will have the opportunity to review America’s most frightening days and to ‘never forget.’

John Hodge, vice president of the Tunnel to Towers Foundation, helped with the arrangements. He said the exhibit was intended to serve as an educational tool.

“Through the presentation of artifacts, including actual steel beams from the towers, documentary video, recordings of first responder radio transmissions as well as guided tours by members of the FDNY, visitors will learn the events of that day from those who lived through the horror,” Hodge said.

“Having this exhibit on display in Brewster for the week is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to take some time out of our busy lives and pay homage to those nine individuals from Putnam who perished on that tragic day,” said County Executive MaryEllen Odell.

The exhibit will arrive in Putnam County via a police motorcycle escort on Sept. 15. The exhibit will open at 5:00 p.m. for first responders and their families to view. Then at 6:00 p.m., Brewster Superintendent Tim Conway will join Hodge in officially welcoming the exhibit to the school campus. They will be joined by retired NYFD Fire Commissioner Sal Cassano and a number of invited government officials. Members of the community are invited to view the exhibit on Tuesday, Sept. 16 from 3-4 p.m.; on Wednesday, Sept. 17 from 3:15-7p.m. and on Thursday, Sept. 18 from 8-10 a.m. and 2:30-4 p.m.

The exhibit will leave Putnam County on Friday, Sept. 19.
